Resource Development:

- **Enoch Pratt Library:** The Enoch Pratt Library in Baltimore on 400 Cathedral Street is a worthwhile resource to identify funding sources. Materials onsite will help you identify funding sources (foundations, businesses, local, national, etc) in the foundation directories as well as the database. You may request a demonstration on how to complete a date search for funding sources. For 50 cents you can purchase a disc and download any information that you find. - **Citizens Planning and Housing Association (CPHA)** provides assistance to nonprofits through resources such as: The Resource Center for Neighborhoods (RCN) which provides training and technical assistance for neighborhood leaders on issues, which are of concern to neighborhoods. They also provide very practical support for the planning of events, for example you can borrow a bull horn for your planned event. - **The Enoch Pratt Free Library** is located in Baltimore City yet they serve the entire state. At the central library there is an office, the "Maryland Department" that is full of identifying demographic data concerning a variety of issues. Staff at the library in the Grants Collection, Social Science & History Department can assist you to identify a variety of community demographic information.
