## **National CCHD Grants - \$240,000**

### **\$75,000 - NO BOUNDARIES COALITION, Baltimore**

This third year, national CCHD grant will continue to enable this unique organization of six neighboring communities to encourage developing leaders known as stewards. In turn, the concerns of poverty-level income folks as well as the voices of the affluent, are heard and addressed. The lack of access to fresh and nutritious foods, public safety and improving police and community relations are currently being promoted. The Coalition is situated in the west and central sections of Baltimore.

### **\$50,000 - UNITED WORKERS ASSOCIATION, Baltimore**

Now in its second cycle of CCHD funding, United Workers has steadily built on a stellar record of advocacy for and success in securing living wages for low income persons. Currently this grant will assist in training folks to work for adequate housing for the working poor folks and developing a land trust to insure long term support for them.

### **\$50,000 - BUILD - BALTIMOREANS UNITED IN LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT, Baltimore**

BUILD has a long established record of developing low income people to lead directly on city-wide initiatives including the living wage movement, Child-First after school care, new rec centers, urban supermarkets, support for the Dream Act and currently "Turnaround Tuesday". This critical effort seeks to secure job opportunities and living wages for previously incarcerated folks.

### **\$35,000 - IMMIGRATION OUTREACH SERVICE CENTER, Baltimore**

This CCHD grant in a new funding cycle will continue to support the Center in its work to train and develop leaders who will encourage initially fearful immigrants to apply for documentation, seek job opportunities as well as language skills in their new homeland.

### **\$15,000 ARUNDEL HOUSE OF HOPE, Glen Burnie, MD.**

CCHD is proud to assist this highly effective organization of churches and community groups with a Technical Assistance to be matched by a local CCHD grant of the same amount. AHOH is working to effect an organizing process to train leaders to work for adequate low income housing and job opportunities for poverty-level income residents in northern Anne Arundel County.

### **\$15,000 NORTHEAST HOUSING INITIATIVE, Baltimore**

This national CCHD Technical Assistance grant to be matched by a local CCHD grant will further enable NHI to qualify hopefully for a CCHD Economic Development grant to be matched by a like amount from funds and property holdings in northeast Baltimore. NHI is working to increase adequate low cost, inclusive housing and eventually a land trust to serve these folks needs.

## **Local CCHD Grants - \$66,000**

**\$15,000 - ARUNDEL HOUSE OF HOPE. See Above**

**\$15,000 - NORTHEAST HOUSING INITIATIVE. See Above**

**\$12,000 - YOUTH EMPOWERMENT SOCIETY, Baltimore**

This third year local CCHD grant will enable Y.E.S. to continue to develop peer advocates among homeless youth in Baltimore City as well as their promoting their lobby efforts in Annapolis in the state legislative bodies.

**\$12,000 - BALTIMORE ALGEBRA PROJECT, Baltimore**

A second year CCHD local grant will aid BAP in its work to help youth develop math skills, literacy and organizing tools to improve students well being in Baltimore. Efforts continue to lobby against incarcerating juveniles as adults.

**\$12,000 B.R.I.D.G.E. MARYLAND, Baltimore**

Now re-organized, BRIDGE is directing the training of clergy and community leaders to effect a more just atmosphere within city neighborhoods; City services, police officers, youth, living and working together in a truly just manner.
